

GREYHOUND WELFARE & INTEGRITY COMMISSION DISCIPLINARY ACTION DECISION

Charge(s):	Mr Steven Burgis, a registered Public Trainer, did on 27 October 2022 at the Maitland Greyhound Club engage in misconduct by:
	(a) First engaging in a verbal altercation with a participant ;
	(b) Further engaging in a physical altercation with a participant ; and
	(c) This altercation was considered to amount to misconduct in the opinion of the Controlling Body.
Disciplinary action taken:	To issue a 3-month suspension, wholly and conditionally suspended for 12 months subject to Mr. Burgis not breaching this, or any like, rule. In addition, a fine in the sum of \$1,000 was issued.

INVESTIGATION

- 1. On 27 October 2022, Mr Steven Burgis attended the Maitland Greyhound Club for the purpose of racing his greyhound "My Paymaster" in race 1.
- 2. Following the running of race 2, in the vicinity of the kennelling area a verbal altercation then took place between Mr Burgis and a greyhound participant, including some physical contact.
- 3. A short time later, Mr Burgis entered into a further verbal altercation with the participant in the vicinity of the car park.

DECISION:

- 1. On Monday 22 May 2023 Mr Burgis was issued with a notice of charge and proposed disciplinary action ("**Notice**").
- 2. In the Notice issued on 22 May 2023 the decision makers proposed a penalty of a 4month suspension, and charged Mr Burgis with an offence under Rule 156(f)(ii) of the Greyhound Racing Rules, which reads:

Rule 156(f)(ii), Rules

An offence is committed if a person (including an official):

. . .

f) has, in relation to a greyhound or greyhound racing done something, or omitted to do something, which in the opinion of a controlling body or stewards:

(ii) constitutes misconduct or is negligent or improper

- 3. The Notice invited Mr Burgis to attend a hearing on Monday 5 June 2023 via Microsoft Teams to enter a plea and make submissions in relation to the charge.
- 4. At the hearing conducted via Microsoft Teams on 5 June 2023, Mr Burgis and a representative assisting in the inquiry:
 - 1. entered a plea of guilty to parts a and c of the charge;
 - 2. entered a plea of not guilty to part b of the charge;
 - 3. made verbal submissions
 - 4. entered written submissions
- 5. In considering the matter, the decision makers considered Mr Burgis' pleas and submissions, as well as all available evidence. The decision makers found that part b of the charge not proven however parts a and c of the charge proven and therefore took the following disciplinary action against Mr Burgis:

Charge 156(f)(ii): To issue a 3-month suspension, wholly and conditionally suspended for 12 months. In addition, a fine of \$1000 was issued.

- 6. In taking this disciplinary action, the decision makers considered all evidence, including:
- Mr Burgis guilty plea
- Mr Burgis unblemished disciplinary record

- Mr Burgis personal and professional circumstances
- His contrition and remorse displayed for his conduct
- Purpose of issuing penalties as a protective measure for the image and interests of the greyhound racing industry
- Principles of specific and general deterrence and what message is sent to the industry in respect to such conduct.
