New GAP facility at Richmond

A new GAP facility at Richmond has officially opened, with the 6.5 hectare property backing on to the Richmond track.

The facility can house 100 greyhounds and will offer a pet prep park and hydrotherapy pool that trainers can also utilise.

The multi-million dollar investment is part of GRNSW's Animal Welfare & Rehoming Program.



LR 22A Abandoned Greyhounds



This local rule was introduced in February 2022. It allows public trainers who have custody of a greyhound that has been abandoned by its owner to re-home the greyhound once certain conditions have been met.

Greyhound owners are responsible for caring for their greyhounds throughout their lives, and owners who fail to do so may face disciplinary action or even a charge under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979.
