On-track vets have injury reduction in their sights

On 1 May 2023, GWIC launched a pilot of an onsite GWIC Veterinarian and Steward at trials held at Richmond and Wentworth Park.

At the Race Injury Reduction Summit held in February 2023, data suggested some serious injuries that occur at trials may be attributable to a greyhound having a pre-existing injury, increasing their chance of further injury during racing. It was decided a pilot may identify whether the attendance of a GWIC Veterinarian at trials can help lower serious injury rates.

Onsite GWIC vets will:

- · vet dogs injured during trialing, and
- assess greyhounds and provide health and welfare advice to trainers

A Steward will also attend to assist participants with eTracking check-ins.



From the Stewards' Box

Race day swabs above the internal threshold - what you need to know

Trainers with greyhounds returning Cobalt or Arsenic concentrations in race-day swabs above the internal threshold and approaching the 100ng/ml or 800ng/ml Rule threshold will receive a notification letter advising them to review and address their supplement and husbandry routines.
