Charge(s):	(1) Mr Roy presented the greyhound 'Nigel's Chance' (" <b>Greyhound</b> ") for the purposes of competing in race 4 at the Wagga meeting on 22 July 2021 in circumstances where the Greyhound was not free of any prohibited substance
Prohibited Substance(s):	Arsenic
Disciplinary action taken:	8-week suspension (wholly and conditionally suspended)

## **REPORT:**

Following receipt of a certificate of analysis from Racing Analytical Services Limited, the Commission conducted an investigation into the results of a post-race urine sample taken from the greyhound, 'Nigel's Chance' ("**Greyhound**") at the Wagga meeting on 22 July 2021.

Further analysis of the sample was conducted by the Racing Science Centre, confirming the presence of arsenic at a mass concentration level above the threshold amount of 800 nanograms per millilitre ("**ng/mL**").

Mr Roy admitted the charge, attended a hearing and provided oral submissions in response to the charge.

## DECISION:

1. Mr Roy is a registered greyhound trainer and the trainer of the Greyhound. The Greyhound competed in race 4 of the Wagga meeting on 22 July 2021 ("**Event**"). Following the Event, a urine sample was taken from the Greyhound.

- 2. The post-Event swab revealed the presence of arsenic at a mass concentration level of 992ng/mL.
- 3. The Commission charged Mr Roy with an offence under Rule 83(2)(a), which reads:

(2) The owner, trainer or person in charge of a greyhound-

(a) nominated to compete in an Event;

...

shall present the greyhound free of any prohibited substance.

- 4. Mr Roy admitted the charge, attended a hearing and provided oral submissions in response to the charge.
- 5. The Commission found the charge proven and took the following disciplinary action against Mr Roy:
  - To suspend his registration for a period of 8-weeks, wholly suspended for a period of 12-months on the condition that Mr Roy does not breach Rule 83(2)(a) during that 12-month period; and
  - 2. To fine him in the amount of \$500.
- 6. In taking this disciplinary action, the Commission considered all evidence, including:
  - Mr Roy has been involved in the greyhound racing industry since 1973, approximately 48 years;
  - Mr Roy has no prior matters in his disciplinary history;
  - Mr Roy's admission of the charge at the earliest opportunity;
  - NSW greyhound racing precedents; and
  - Mr Roy's submissions in mitigation of penalty, including his personal circumstances and his review of and amendment to his animal husbandry practices.
- 7. In addition, the Greyhound was disqualified from race 4 at the Wagga meeting on 22 July 2021 pursuant to Rule 83(4) of the Rules.
