

Greyhound Rehoming Policy



During the rehoming process a temperament assessment may be required if there are concerns the greyhound may not be suitable for rehoming due to behavioural issues. **Temperament assessments** must be completed by a veterinarian practitioner or other person approved by GWIC.



Steps to have a temperament assessment completed







Contact GWIC to request the list of approved assessors





Download and print **Temperament Assessment** Report to take to assessment



Take the veterinarian's clinical report to the assessment



Assessor to complete the Temperament **Assessment Report**



Assessor to provide GWIC and participant with completed report

Advising GWIC of the assessment outcome

If the greyhound has been deemed unsuitable for rehoming the greyhound can then be euthanased by a veterinarian. Once this has been done, the participant must submit the following to GWIC:

The completed **Temperament Assessment** report

Euthanasia of Greyhound - Vet Certification form
